a. Bill 2019-35 Ordinance 2019-1333

An Ordinance Adding Section 135-100 To The Municipal Code In Regards To Police Officer Training.

Chief Christopher Looney was present.

24 hours of continuing education per year is required of Police Officers.

Sometimes there is the need to improve the Officer's skill set.

Training can be \$1,000 – \$1,500

The Department previously used Officer Contract for training. This has not always panned out to be successful for various reasons.

Ordinance for advanced training would be a blanket ordinance and help to retain officers.
