

**November 1, 2021**

The Council for the Town of Carrollton met in regular session on Monday, November 1, 2021, at 6:00 p.m., at City Hall at 206 W. Washington, Carrollton, MO 64633

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Frank Olvera.

### **ROLL CALL**

Roll call was taken and answered by the following: Councilwoman McCoy, Councilman Higgins, Councilwoman Bliss, Mayor Olvera, Councilman Hughes and Councilwoman Brunjes. Counselor Cowherd was absent.

### **APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

***A motion was made by Councilwoman Bliss and seconded by Councilman Hughes to approve the Agenda as presented. The motion passed without opposition with the following council members voting yes: McCoy, Higgins, Bliss, Hughes and Brunjes.***

### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

Minutes for the Regular Meeting held on October 18, 2021 were presented.

- b. Dustin Brown – Dog Issues

Dustin Brown addressed the Council.

Mr. Brown advised the Council of the issues involving his own dog, contained in his yard and a dog repeatedly at large attacking his dog.

Mr. Brown also asked for a clarification of the current animal control ordinance.

Sgt. Hand was present and gave a detailed accounting of the particular incident and the actions that were taken. The owner of the dog was given a citation.

A lengthy discussion was held regarding the issue at hand, the current ordinance and the fact that it was currently being revised.

Sgt. Hand also stated it would be beneficial if the owner of the dog being attacked would state the seriousness of the attack when they call in. Animal Control Officer, Stephanie Bugbee has increased the number of dog licenses that are being issued. Bugbee is consistently checking on dog licensing and working on a positive way to get more dogs licensed.

No other action was taken.

b. Health Insurance Proposal – D. Phillips Insurance

Dale Phillips and Tyler Phillips presented their proposed plan for employee health insurance.

Group based plan.

United Healthcare – Med Plus.

The proposed plan would be a savings of \$31,675.80 compared to current plan the employees are enrolled in.

a. Street Assistant Supervisor – Bryan Mathis

A daily log of street department activity was given to Council.

Working on sander- have one working. Parts have been ordered.

Meeting with Capital Paving. They may begin milling on November 3, 2021 and paving on Friday, November 5, 2021.

Due to the water project, 10<sup>th</sup> Street was taken off the list for paving. Other streets were added. More on Leslie, 6<sup>th</sup> St. to 9<sup>th</sup> St., Walnut and 14<sup>th</sup> St. to Park.

b. Wastewater Supervisor – Tammy Hamblen

A log of the department's daily activity was given to the Council.

Hauling sludge – would like to get 20-30 more loads out.

Ronnie will attend school, February and March- 2 days/week classes.

Chad will attend the same school, April – May.

Tammy stated she will be taking a Wastewater Treatment Plant Operations Specialist. This is a college course and will be higher than her "A" License.

Tammy also stated she will be having back surgery, December 10, 2021 and will be off two (2) weeks then on light duty for 6-8 weeks.

They also have a sludge truck that will need to be replaced.
