The Council for the Town of Carrollton met in regular session on Monday, April 18, 2022, at 6:00 p.m., at City Hall at 206 W. Washington, Carrollton, MO 64633

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Olvera.

ROLL CALL

Roll call was taken and answered by the following: Councilwoman McCoy, Councilman Higgins, Councilwoman Bliss, Mayor Olvera, Counselor Cowherd, Councilman Hughes and Councilwoman Brunjes.

AGENDA.

A motion was made by Councilwoman Bliss and seconded by Councilman Hughes to approve the Agenda as presented. The motion passed without opposition with the following council members voting yes: McCoy, Higgins, Bliss, Hughes and Brunjes.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Minutes for the Regular Meeting held on April 4, 2022 were presented.

A motion was made by Councilman Hughes and seconded by Councilwoman Brunjes to approve the minutes for the Regular Council meeting held on April 4, 2022 as presented. The motion passed without opposition with the following council members voting yes: McCoy, Higgins, Bliss, Hughes and Brunjes.

NEW BUSINESS

a. City Clerk, Dana Reimer – 2022 Election Results

Clerk Reimer read the certified election results for the Municipal Election held on April 5, 2022.

A motion was made by Councilman Hughes and seconded by Councilwoman Brunjes to approve approve the certification of election results for the Municipal Election held on April 5, 2022. The motion passed without opposition with the following council members voting yes: McCoy, Higgins, Bliss, Hughes and Brunjes.

b. Jerrod Crockett – Youth Police Academy Community Involvement.

Mr. Crockett arrived late and this agenda item was addressed following Item “c”

Mr. Crockett addressed the Council regarding requesting community support for a Youth Police Academy. He stated he had previously had a meeting with the YMCA. Mr. Crockett was seeking a donation of \$2,000 - \$2,500 for T-shirts and possibly other items for approximately 50 students.

Discussion was held and input from Chief Turk and Sheriff McCoy. This matter is going to be further researched and possibly revisited at a later time.

- c. Police Chief, Michael Turk and Sheriff Deputy Eric Dempsey – Moswin Digital Radio System.

Police Chief Turk and Sheriff Deputy Dempsey addressed the Council. Chief Turk reviewed the advantages of the MOSWIN Digital radio system and how it is superior to the analog system that is currently being used. Currently there are numerous transmission issues A&W contract which is a State bid. Chief Turk is requesting ARPA Funds for 8 handheld radios for the Officers and dual band Mobile for 5 Patrol vehicles for a total amount of \$62, 208.25.

A motion was made by Councilwoman Bliss and seconded by Councilman Hughes to approve purchasing with ARPA Funds, 8 handheld radios and dual band Mobile for 5 patrol vehicles from A&W for a total amount of \$62,208.25. The motion passed without opposition with the following council members voting yes: McCoy, Higgins, Bliss, Hughes and Brunjes.

- d. Council To Provide Letter Of Approval To The Carroll County Cattleman's Association For A Picnic Liquor License For The Carroll County Fair.

This request is done annually for the Carroll County Fair which this year will be held, July 6-9, 2022.

A motion was made by Councilwoman Bliss and seconded by Councilman Hughes to approve a Picnic Liquor License for the Carroll County Cattleman's Association for the Carroll County Fair, July 6-9, 2022. The motion passed without opposition with the following council members voting yes: McCoy, Higgins, Bliss, Hughes and Brunjes.

- e. Request For Temporary Liquor License For The Wing Dive d/b/a Rover Bottoms Brewing Co.

Chief Turk has completed background checks etc. This temporary ninety (90) day license will allow them to have soft openings and work up to their full license.

A motion was made by Councilman Hughes and seconded by Councilman Higgins to approve a Temporary Liquor License to Wing Dive. The motion passed without opposition with the following council members voting yes: McCoy, Higgins, Bliss, Hughes and Brunjes.

Lauren stated the Town has not been charging the Chamber a rental fee for the use of the Trolley. Lauren is proposing charging the Chamber a \$50.00 rental fee for the use of the Trolley to cover upcoming maintenance etc.

MAYOR'S REPORT

a. Rupe Center

Lock Steel Building has put together a design for the expansion for the Rupe Center that would include a space for Harvester's Food drop. The Mayor requested that Council look over this information and this will be revisited and ARPA funds would be used for this project.

The Town is in need for Board members for the Public Safety Board, City Works Board and the Library Board.

Bliss: Spoke about House Bill 2443 proposed by Rep. Dave Griffith regarding heritage properties. Bliss wrote a letter to Rep. Peggy McLaugh to ask for her support of this Bill. Bliss encouraged the Council to do the same.
