

**MINUTES FOR THE TOWN OF CARROLLTON**  
**April 3, 2017**

The council for the Town of Carrollton met in regular session on Monday, April 3, 2017, at 6:00 p.m., at City Hall, 206 W. Washington, Carrollton, MO 64633.

**ROLL CALL**

Roll call was taken and answered by the following: Councilman Bartlett, Councilwoman Horine, Mayor Mathis, Councilman Shields and Councilwoman Ward. Counselor Cowherd and Councilwoman McCoy were absent.

**APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

Addition: Approval of Minutes – March 6, 2017 – previously lacked quorum.

***A motion was made by Councilman Shields and seconded by Councilwoman Horine to approve the agenda with the addition of approval of the March 6, 2017 minutes. The motion passed without opposition with the following council members voting yes: Bartlett, Horine, Shields and Ward. McCoy absent.***

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES.**

Minutes from the ***Regular Meeting held on March 6, 2017*** were presented.

This matter was tabled due to lack of a majority vote of those members present at the meeting.

Minutes from the ***Regular Meeting held on March 20, 2017*** were presented.

**NEW BUSINESS**

- a. Sharon Metz- CAEA

Sharon Metz was present to inform the council of further planning activities regarding the Solar Eclipse.

Some of the activities that are currently planned are:

- Billboard sign on Hwy 210 - Total Eclipse Of The Heartland
- Five days of events.

- Had a meeting with Clint Mathis, Municipal Utilities regarding assistance

for what will be needed for the carnival activities that involve 9 RV's and 12 rides.

Some of the additional activities are a mechanical bull and a 25' water slide.

Thanked the Town and Council with all their help in promoting event.

The school has big plans for the students.

Val Germann, astronomer, formerly of Carrollton will be presenting a program at the Rupe Center at the end of the month.

Lonnie Sensenich, Fire Chief will be heading the First Responders.

Next planning meeting – April 12, 2017 at 7:00 p.m.

Funding – looking for donations and fund raisers. Tax payers money cannot be used. Mayor Mathis stated that funds from the Rupe Interest could be used being this event is for the citizens.

***A motion was made by Councilwoman Horine and seconded by Councilman Bartlett to donate \$5,000 from Rupe Interest to the 2017 Total Solar Eclipse Committee. The motion passed without opposition with the following council members voting yes: Horine and Shields. Bartlett and Ward abstained. McCoy was absent.***

b. Museum Board – Sip, Snack and Stroll at the Museum

Lisa Ream spoke on behalf of the Museum.

On May 20, 2017 the Museum is holding a Sip, Snack and Stroll at the Museum as a promotional event for the Museum.

All wine will be donated and there will be no vendors. Entrance to the event will be a free will donation.

The State has confirmed that since there will be no vendors selling liquor no liquor license would be required. Sgt. Looney also agrees.

c. Police Chief – Robert Turner – Drug Task Force

Chief Turner introduced Detective Donnie Hammond of the Lafayette County Drug Task Force and Cassandra Brown, Town of Carrollton and Carroll County Prosecuting Attorney were present.

Detective Hammond:

There are 21 Drug Task Force units in Missouri. Carroll County has been a part of the Lafayette County unit for the past two years.

Drug Task Force can take the investigation further than the Police department.

The number of meth labs are down from previous years.

Explained the dangers of the “shake and bake meth labs”.

Discussed the dangers of powdered Fentanyl and how quickly it absorbs in to the skin.

Discussed the drug Narcon – used for over doses and how it needs to be immediately available for first responders.

Also discussed funding issues plague law enforcement but expectations continually increase.

d. Police Chief, Robert Turner - Airport

Fuel system is back up and running. Jack Vantrump assisted in the rewiring and fuses.

Working on implementing a tie up fee.

Airport is still not cleaned up like it should be. Kim Burger, Planning and Zoning Administrator will go down and inspect the airport.

a. Fire Chief, Lonnie Sensenich

52 runs for the month of March.

123 burn requests for the month of March.

First Quarter – 148 calls, 49 outside of City limits.

7 training sessions with 172 man hours.

Rupe Center Updates: doors have been ordered, replaced baseboards.

Granite tops are in the process of being bid out.

July 4<sup>th</sup>: Starting collecting donations

Storm Siren on south end of Town – being re-painted and updated. Put up a 55' pole and a new radio.

b. Police Chief, Robert Turner

761 calls- 94 traffic and 69 follow-ups.

Officer Perkinson and Chief Turner attended a 40 hour Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training in Columbia. This was no cost to the Department. This was very beneficial training. This training is designed to educate and prepare Officers who come in contact with individuals with mental illness, to recognize the signs and symptoms and the proper way to respond appropriately and effectively to this type of incident. Great assistance to suicide prevention.

Chief Turner and Officer Perkinson both spoke of the impact this training had on them and the importance of it.

Currently, Officer Perkinson is the only CIT Certified Officer on the force.

Two dates for taser training.

Received 5 applications for the open position.
